Merry Christmas and Happy New Year to All!

The Philippines celebrates Christmas as the best in the whole world. It is known as the country that celebrates the longest. It starts as early as September and ends the first Sunday of the New Year, which is called the Feast of the Three Kings. The Philippines also have customs and traditions that we can say is uniquely ours. These customs are deeply rooted and influenced by the Roman Catholic Church.

Here are the most common customs and traditions.

1. Iconic Belen...the Nativity Scene. It shows the image of the Holy Family and is a standard decor in homes and in front of churches. Filipinos call it Belen, short of Bethlehem.



2. Noche Buena...Holy Night... Refers to the Christmas Eve Feast on December 24, after coming home from the midnight mass.





3. Simbang Gabi...it is a series of very early morning masses for 9 days, that starts on December 16 and ends on Christmas Eve. After the mass, church goers enjoys snacks of Arrozcaldo, puto, puto Bong Bong.



- 4. Misa debGallo ...the Christmas Eve Mass, the ninth of the Simbang Gabi and marks the official start of Christmas. This mass usually includes the re-enactment of the Birth Jesus Christ. It is believed that if you attend all the 9 Simbang Gabi, your wishes and prayers will come true.
- 5. Parol or Christmas lantern...it is a five painted star shaped, made of bamboo sticks and covered with bright coloured paper with a candle inside. It symbolizes the Star of Bethlehem where Jesus was born. It is also hung in front of homes to light the way for early morning church goers.





- 6. Namamasko or Christmas carollers...young children go from house to house singing Christmas carols to the homeowners. In return, they are given money as Pamasko which is then divided among themselves.
- 7. Pamasko or Aguinaldo...young children go visit their godfathers and godmothers to get their gifts of money or clothes and candies.
- 8. Media Noche...a tradition where people stay awake to greet each other during the first few seconds of the new year. It is then followed by a sumptuous feast. People also set off fireworks that will drive evil spirits away and usher in a prosperous new year.
- 9. Fiesta ng Tatlong Hari...Feast of the Three Kings....the first Sunday of the new year is celebrated as the day when the 3 kings visited the newborn Jesus. Special mass is celebrated and a sumptuous feast follows after the mass.





Muskoka Day Trip, Saturday, September 23




